Reflect:

1. Beginning with the first line, “Hear my words, Lord!” this Psalm is centered in the experience of prayer, describing particularly laying everything out before God each morning. How might a daily practice of prayer, whether each morning or another time, be a valuable part of our expression of faith? Are there other ways you might like to lean more deeply into prayer?
2. This Psalm describes God as opposed to evil, despising the violent and dishonest, and even requesting God condemn them to failure. How does this depiction settle with your understanding of God? How might it challenge us to understand God more fully?
3. Ending on a high note, the Psalm talks of taking refuge in God and blessing the righteous. In your life, what might taking refuge in God look like? What might it look like to live righteously?
