But if we learn to listen to our own needs and wants, that listening can free us to learn to become truly present to the inner deep and fragile beauty of those under our care. With patience, with time, we can develop relationships of respect, listening, presence, and truthfulness with those we care for.

# **Small Group Discussion Questions:**

- 1. *Introduction*: What drew you to participating in this study on community and neighboring?
- 2. *Application*: We're using Mister Rogers and Henri Nouwen as guides to loving our neighbors. Who stands out in your life as someone who exemplified the love of neighbor?

- 7. Conclusion: How can we pray for one another this week?
